Key Tour Information

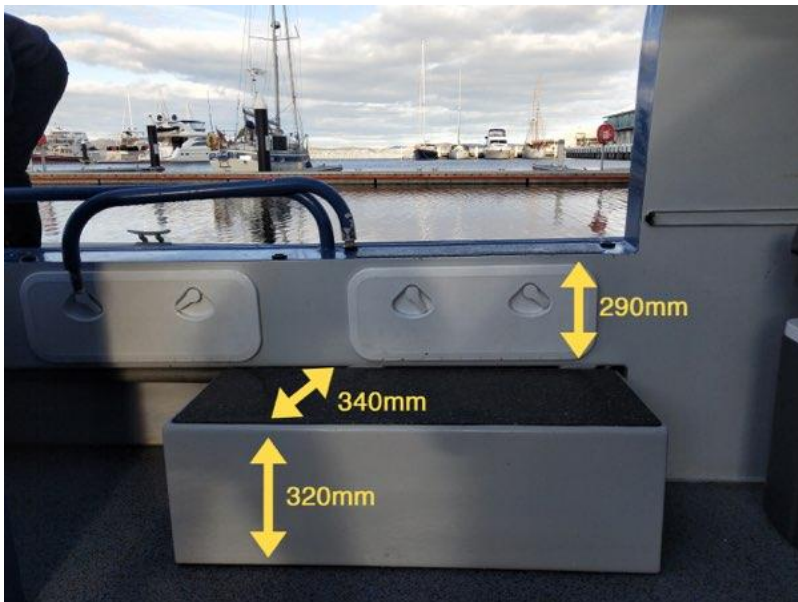
- 2.5 Hour coastal cruise on enclosed style vessels
- Highlights: Cruise to the Iron Pot Lighthouse, circumnavigate uninhabited Betsey Island and join the search for wildlife
- Tours start and finish at our Hobart waterfront office
- Cruise departs daily at 2pm, returning approximately 4.30pm. We do offer a morning cruise option in summer months departing 10am and returning approximately 12.30pm

Hobart Office

- Centrally located on the Hobart waterfront – this is an easy meeting point to begin your journey
- Address: Dock Head Building, Franklin Wharf, Hobart
- Arrive 15 minutes prior to your cruise departure time
- There is time restricted parking available opposite the office including an accessible car park for pick-up and drop-off
- The closest all-day parking is available at either:
 - Argyle Street Carpark – 500 metres away, undercover car-parking
 - Market Place Carpark – 400 metres away, undercover car-parking
 - Evans Street Carpark – 550 metres away, open-air parking
- Taxi or Uber is also available to our Hobart office
- There is ramped entry to the booking office where you will meet for the tour

Vessel Boarding and Seating

- Access to the vessel is from a floating pontoon style jetty with a 1190mm wide gangway ramp. Top of the gangway is 60 metres from the Hobart Office, with a further 40 metres to the vessel
- Once boarding, you will be on the vessel for the duration of the two-and-a-half-hour cruise.
- There is a 400mm step up to the vessel. Once inside there is a 290mm and 320mm step down
- The cabin has 12 seats on a slightly sloped platform meaning that there is a small step to the back two rows of seats



Toilet Facilities

- There is a toilet on the vessel, but no toilet facilities in our Hobart office
- The nearest accessible toilets to the office are available 100m away at a local café. Staff can advise you of the location of this upon check-in. They have accessible toilet facilities
- The bathroom is located at the front of the cabin and has a 450mm access width with three small steps down of 200mm, 260mm and 200mm. There is standing room of 183cm once inside the bathroom
